Having a local SBDC during this turbulent and scary time was a life saver (at least a business saver). I was able to keep my doors open and have even grown the business.

The most recent interactions have been regarding my exiting strategy. We have brainstormed various ideas to sell the business. Over the next couple years, I will need their input and support for this transition, and I know the new owner will rely on them as much as I have.

It is for the good of our local economy to continue funding the SBDC. Small business is the backbone of our community and has a huge impact.
