I have lived in the Portland metro area since 1990. While the beaches, mountains, lakes, forests and ocean are beautiful, I cherish the parks and trail system that are so conveniently accessible right here in the Portland metro area. Our elected officials have allowed houselessness to take over sidewalks, parks, trails, hillsides, interstate rights of way and private property. I have logged 1,000s of miles running and cycling the Springwater Trail and I-205 multi-use path and have seen first hand how our elected officials have allowed, even encouraged, the degradation of what was once an asset of the city.
