# Joint Ways & Means Committee Written Testimony for the CORE-3

(Central Oregon Ready, Responsive, Resilient Emergency Coordination and Training Facility)

Members of the committee I was unable to provide my testimony for this important program yesterday. As the Vice- Chair of this program, it was my intent to seek continued additional funding for this valuable project that would not only benefit Deschutes, Crook, and Jefferson Counties but the whole state and in particular all of Eastern Oregon. This facility would not only provide Emergency Coordination but would be a regional training facility to benefit all Eastern Oregon city and county law enforcement and fire agencies. The facility would reduce the often costly and excessive travel for all smaller public agencies to travel to Salem or the Portland area for training.

#### The Problem

There are insufficient facilities to meet the region's need for coordinated emergency response and recovery, and training and preparedness for emergency services personnel.

#### The Solution

A multi-agency coordination center for emergency operations that also serves as a training facility for current and future emergency services personnel.

### **Significance**

Emergency Coordination Center – Acts as a staging ground and emergency coordination center to respond to large scale disasters or shocks (e.g. Cascadia). This would be a significant component of Central Oregon and the State's emergency response capability.

<u>Training Facility</u> – Provides high quality facilities for ongoing and specialized training for safety personnel in Central Oregon as well as other regions in the State and the Pacific Northwest.

#### Scope and Costs

Phase one of development will include an emergency coordination center/classroom facility, an emergency vehicle operator course (EVOC) and a driver's skill pad, and a fire tower and burn building. Phase one of the project is estimated to cost \$34M. This rises to \$50M if you include the value of the land.

The full buildout will include a wide array of additional facilities and props for public safety and emergency preparedness training.

Local partners have provided \$17M in the form of land (300 acres) and project development costs to date. Our goal is to raise essentially the same amount from the state and feds.

#### **Governance and Engagement**

The CORE3 Executive Council is the decision-making body for the project, and 27 local, state, and federal agencies have signed the CORE3 MOU. Leadership is comprised of a chair and two vice chairs, representing local government, fire, and law enforcement.

Central Oregon Intergovernmental Council has been asked to staff and project manage the CORE3 facility through the development/construction phase of the project.


