TriMet's Transit-Oriented Development Program is keen to support its agency partners seeking to advance transfer of Hall Boulevard from ownership by the State of Oregon to the City of Tigard. This jurisdictional transfer will allow Hall Blvd to continue functioning as the City's backbone while laying the groundwork for future corridor investments which maximize connectivity through a variety of integrated and multi-modal options for transit riders, pedestrians, and bicyclists.
