SB 1012 Public Hearing Authorizes county to allow homestead rebuilt by same owner on same lot to replace homestead destroyed by September 2020 wildfires to have specially assessed value equal to destroyed homestead's real market value for 2020-2021 property tax year, to extent of square footage of destroyed homestead.

I had noticed this article in my inbox this evening and was excited to see that someone would have the afterthought to get this out to individuals that have been greatly affected by the 2020 Wildfires.

rebuild a home and because of the year it is considered a new build thus not in the category of the property tax that many of us had voted for. We are just trying to get ourselves back into a home something that can be so taken for granted.
