

Senate Bill 819

I support SB 819.

The Parent or foster care parent is critical by creating an environment that is stable/predictable and supports the needs of his/her student. They help the student be successful with the decisions they make.

Consistency at school and home reduce confusion. Confusion has the greatest impact on the education, life choices of the student, and their reactions to outcomes. Parents or foster parents must understand what their child is experiencing.

SB 819 Summary,

Requires the parent or foster parent must give informed and written consent for the student with disability to be placed on the program. The parent or foster parent was not asked to provide consent before having an opportunity to meaningfully participate in a meeting of an individualized education program.

SECTION 8.

[(1)] (2) Notwithstanding subsection (3) of this section, a minor of any age may give consent, without the consent of a parent or guardian of the minor, to receive reproductive health care information and services from a physician, physician assistant licensed under....

Does not require that parent or foster parent receive information.
