- SB 408 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Oregon Health Authority to establish process to receive and review health care profession scope of practice requests and impact statements.
- SB 608
Prohibits insurers offering policies or certificates of health insurance and pharmacy benefit managers from requiring claim for reimbursement of prescription drug to include modifier or other indicator that drug is 340B drug.
- SB 1042 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires Oregon Health Policy Board to produce and provide to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to health by December 31, 2024, comprehensive report regarding success in achieving aims of Oregon Integrated and Coordinated Health Care Delivery System.
- SB 492
Imposes new requirements on the determination of health services to be provided in state medical assistance program.
- SB 1041
Prohibits cost-sharing on certain health insurance coverage of supplemental and diagnostic breast examinations.
- SB 192
Requires Oregon Health Authority to study ways to lower cost of prescription drugs.
- SB 60
Prohibits Oregon Health Authority from requiring associate degree or higher for eligibility for licensure as emergency medical services provider.
- SB 1074 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Oregon Health Authority to administer two-year demonstration project in two counties to test whether expanding scope of compensable services provided by community health workers can improve outcomes for low-income families and children at risk of entering foster care system.

SB 565

Requires insurer, pharmacy benefit manager, Public Employees' Benefit Board, Oregon Educators Benefit Board and health care service contractor to count payments made by or on behalf of enrollee for costs of certain prescription drugs when calculating enrollee's contribution to out-of-pocket maximum, deductible, copayment, coinsurance or other cost-sharing for drugs.

SB 520 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Establishes Medical Release Advisory Committee within State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision.

Public Hearing

SB 190

Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to study factors contributing to cost of health insurance premiums.

SB 922

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study screening for diseases.

SB 1079

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study hospital licensing requirements.

SB 1085

Allows pharmacist to test and provide treatment for certain health conditions.
