Measure Description:

Modifies statutory provisions relating to school nutrition, speech-language pathology programs, investigations of sexual conduct or abuse, issuing subpoenas, and the role of education service districts in the Student Success Act. Modifies statutory provisions relating to investigations to refer to conduct, not individuals.
