How We Listen to Community

- Community Advisory Council, Early Learning Council, and community-based Board of Directors
- Service Integration Teams (teams of local people helping neighbors meet basic needs: housing, utilities, car repairs)
- Developing Community Health Assessment, Community Health Improvement Plan, and Health Equity Plan
- Surveys, interviews, event outreach, and populationspecific listening sessions with community members
- Relationships with community partners

Housing

Project Turnkey (55 units)

Temporary non-congregant housing to individuals and families

Stratus Village (175 units)

Affordable community housing

Sheridan Housing project (72 units)

Houses people with mental health and substance use challenges

AnyDoor Place (36 beds)

Night by night shelter as well as service center and day-use center

- YCCO has invested more than \$10 million into housing and housing-related projects
- Thousands more dollars for housingrelated needs like cooling and heating

Early Learning

- Upstream investments in maternal care, early childhood education, and family supports:
 - Pregnancy and post-partum care (home visiting)
 - Preschool enrollment
 - Parenting support
 - School readiness
 - Childcare expansion
 - Service Integration Teams
- Aligning health care and education to improve wellness and reduce costs
- Community Baby Showers

Community Prevention & Wellness Fund

- Created in 2015 to braid funding for sustainable investments in Social Determinants of Health and Equity (SDOH-E)
- YCCO commits at least 10% of our quality incentive dollars each year
- Examples:
 - Family Wellbeing Council
 - PAX Good Behavior Game
 - "Responder Life" Trauma-Informed Peer Support Training
 - RULER Social Emotional Learning (SEL) Program
 - Universal Home Visiting





Looking Ahead

- Over the next two years, YCCO is partnering with Oregon Health Authority to develop and implement:
 - Healthier Oregon expansion (July 2023)
 - New 1115 Medicaid Waiver, including new climate, housing, nutrition benefits (Jan. 2024)
 - Basic Health Plan to provide Medicaid-like coverage to Oregonians between 138-200% of the Federal Poverty Guideline (July 2024)
- Careful planning is needed to ensure success for members, providers, and OHA
- Infrastructure must be in place to ensure there is sufficient and equitable access
