- More than 3 million middle and high school students use tobacco and e-cigarettes.
- 85% of youth e-cigarette users use flavored products.
- Tobacco is the leading cause of preventable death and disease in Oregon, killing over 8,000 Oregonians a year.

As you know, nicotine is highly addictive and can harm adolescent brain development. We need to take action to protect future kids from damaging their health and being addicted to vaping.

Getting flavored tobacco if you are under 21 isn't difficult. Many of the youth are able to purchase it in stores:

 The Oregon Health Authority recently reported that 25% of Oregon businesses sold tobacco to underage buyers.

I ask you to please support HB 3090, the Preventing Nicotine Addiction Act. This policy can prevent future kids across Oregon from nicotine addiction and poor physical, mental, and developmental health challenges caused by these products.
