By linking arms with a network of referring agencies, teams of volunteers, and a community of supporters, we are able to share the gift of hope by furnishing homes for hundreds of families in need throughout Central Oregon each year.

Since Furnish Hope's inception almost four years ago, we have reached major milestones and made significant organizational enhancements that strengthen our ability to deliver hope and home furnishings to our Central Oregon neighbors. We are proud to share these accomplishments with you:

Furnished 1,000 homes since our inception. 572 homes were furnished this year alone.

Grew our volunteer program to over 100 individuals.

Increased our referring agency network to 64 partners.

Funding Hope in 2022

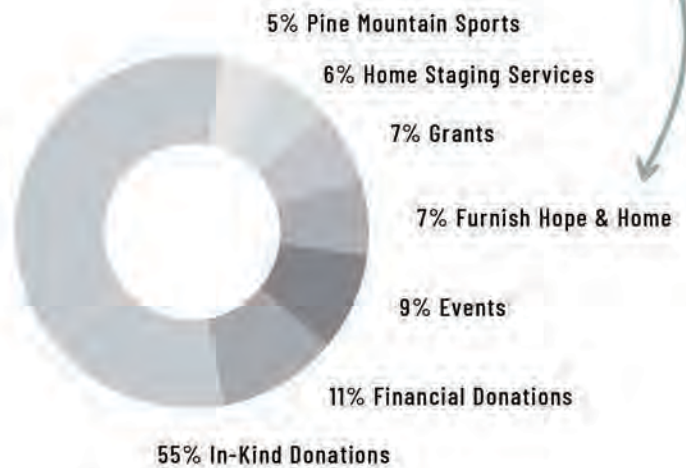


In September, the doors of our resale store opened to the public, providing a steady revenue stream to support our program, an additional way to raise awareness, and opportunity to stay connected to our recipients.

Operations Expenses

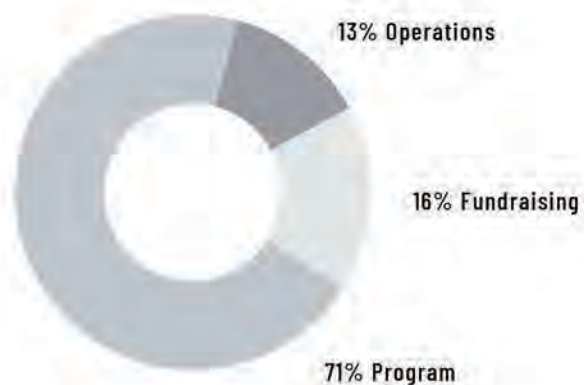
Supports an optimal foundation with software, insurance and administrative personnel.

Funds needed to complete the Cycle of Hope including program related staffing.

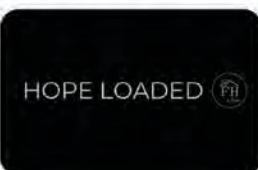

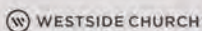
