# **Council Operations Funding**

- Enhance capacity for incident management informed emergency response.

## **Education and Outreach Grant Funding**

- Encourage innovative partnerships to increase awareness.
- Facilitate meaningful outreach and education projects statewide.



### **Emergency Control Account Funding**

► Allow the Council to continue to allocate meaningful resources to emergency control projects.

#### The Council will:

- Facilitate eradication or control of new or expanding infestations by providing grants on an asneeded basis.
- Save the Oregon money by providing funds when they are most likely to contribute to success.
