## **Summary of Fiscal Impact**

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Committee on Emergency Management, General Government, and Veterans, to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.

This measure adds District Attorneys or certain Oregon State Police employees employed on or after January 1, 2025, to a Police and Fire classification under the Public Employees Retirement System (PERS) for service performed after this date. The normal age of retirement for police officers and firefighters is lowered from 60 to 55 years, for members of the Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan who retire on or after January 1, 2025. The measure also creates a new benefit plan for employees in select hazardous duty positions, starting in 2030.

A more complete fiscal analysis on the measure will be prepared as the measure is considered in the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.
