- Advance U.S. DOE's equity, environmental, and energy justice priorities, including the Justice40 Initiative.
- Invest in America's workforce.



GRID RESILIENCE OBJECTIVES

ODOE Project Priorities:



Natural Hazards Mitigation. Invest in projects located in areas of the state directly affected by natural hazards.



Community Benefit & Equity. Invest in and engage with disadvantaged and Tribal communities.



Maximize Community Benefits. Support immediate investments in projects that provide community benefits as soon as possible.



Evaluate for Future Funding Years.



GRID RESILIENCE FEDERAL FUNDING

Federal Funding Amount:

Legislation set five-part formula based on population, area, probability of disruptive events, severity of disruptive events, and expenditure on mitigation efforts.

- ▶ Oregon Allocation ~\$50 M total over the life of the program.
- ▶ 95% will be subgranted to eligible subrecipients.

ODOE Allocation Years 1 & 2: \$19,907,304

Subgrants to Eligible Subrecipients:
 \$18,911,939

Today's Request

ODOE Allocation Year 3: \$10,991,729

- Subgrants to Eligible Subrecipients: \$10,442,743
- 2nd opportunity to be informed by first round lessons learned

GRID RESILIENCE STATE MATCH

State Match Requirement:

States and Tribes (Applicants for USDOE fund) required to match 15% of DOE funds.

Oregon's match expect to be roughly \$7.5 million over the life of the grant program.

- ► State match requirements for first 2 allocations: \$2,986,096 Provided in ODOE 23/25 budget.
- ▶ State match requirements need for FY24 allocation: \$1,648,760

ODOE will return to a future Joint Ways and Means or Emergency Board to request matching funds.



GRID RESILIENCE NEXT STEPS

Year 3 allocation announced

• January 18, 2024

ODOE to open first round of Opportunity Announcement to eligible applicants.

• Goal – March 2024

Year 3 federal application due

• April 17, 2024

ODOE notifies US DOE of first round of project selections


• Goal – July 2024

First round Performance Agreements are fully executed

• Goal – Fall 2024

Second round Opportunity Announcement opens to eligible applicants

• Goal – Early 2025
