WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure allows district school boards to establish policies to encourage students to perform maintenance tasks in district buildings to develop vocational skills. Effective January 1, 2025.

Detailed Summary:

Allows a district school board to establish a policy to encourage students to develop vocational skills by performing maintenance tasks at a building or property under control of the district. Outlines considerations that must be included in the policy. Effective January 1, 2025.

BACKGROUND:

Career and Technical Education (CTE) is a program for high school and community college students that incorporates technical skills and applied learning to help prepare students for careers . Work-based learning opportunities are components under the <u>Oregon CTE State Plan</u>. Work-based learning creates structured learning in the workplace or simulated environments to provide students with firsthand experiences and skills in a given career field. The <u>Work-Based Learning Handbook</u>, co-authored by the Oregon Department of Education and the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, provides an overview of work-based learning in Oregon, including work-based learning types, and criteria and requirements for the program. Work experiences under work-based learning include pre-apprenticeship programs, school based experiences, and internships.
