HB 4101 -1 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Requires the Secretary of State (SOS) request personal information when registering a business. Sharing personal information would be voluntary. That information would then be shared by State of Oregon Agencies, small business development centers and Organizations described in the measure. Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Detailed Summary:

The measure requires the Secretary of State (SOS) collect Information about the ethnicity, gender, and veteran status of each owner and principle who applies or renews business registration. Requires sharing information about ethnicity, gender, or veteran status voluntary for those applying for or renewing a business registration. Requires the SOS to share collected information about ethnicity, gender, or veteran status with other state agencies, small business development centers, or Organizations that are community based, foster economic development, and engage in efforts to increase the number of minority owned business, woman owned businesses, or veteran owned businesses in the state as determined by the business registration information center within the SOS office. The operative date of the measure is January 1, 2028. Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Voluntary disclosure of personal information
- The government's use of the personal information

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-1 The amendment makes the operative date of the measure January 1, 2026 and makes technical changes to the bill.

BACKGROUND:

During the 2023 session business associations asked that more information be collected by the SOS in the business registration process and that demographic and contact information would then be shared with qualifying associations. This measure is a continuation of the work done on HB 3272.
