- Approximately 4.1 million Americans are poised to turn 65
 this year and every year through 2027, according to
 a <u>report</u> from the Alliance for Lifetime Income. Dubbed by
 experts as "peak 65" or the "silver tsunami," the figure

 history.
- Nationally, 23% of older Americans are living in poverty; in Oregon the rate would be 43% in the absence of social security

- A Broader and Braided Continuum of Rent Assistance
 - Older Oregonians need a blend of transition-based assistance, and two types of permanent rent assistance – full and partial
