

A lack of integrated and coordinated resources results in a more expensive and less than desirable outcome for communities. By providing centralized supports, a more sustainable impact across Marion and Polk Counties is possible. Utilizing an integrated service delivery approach, a **cross-sector social services resource center** directly supports affordable housing and improves the quality of life for community members who are facing critical needs and challenges.

The main goal of our community-based model is to address the Social Determinants of Health at the local level by focusing on stability, health, and well-being. The progression of these building blocks is key for addressing Oregon's top priorities around mental health, addiction, homelessness, and unemployment.

The proposed centralized service model will integrate a comprehensive network of strategic community partners, amplifying community assets and reducing barriers to support, while simultaneously supporting residents in affordable housing units. With over 15 strength-based partners<sup>\*</sup>, this project addresses intervention, prevention and asset building, reducing the negative impact on individuals and families. By bringing a broad range of person and family-centered supports within easy reach, this model prevents minor social circumstances from spiraling out of control, ultimately reducing social service costs.

StoreIT will provide the critical space for centralized services, and offer employment opportunities and job shadowing with an aim to empower individuals and contribute to the economic growth of our community.
