Subject:	SB 1522 – Relating to individuals with intellectual disabilities. Work Session Recommendations
The measure repeals statutes related to civil commitments for individuals with intellectual disabilities. The Department of Human Services is required to report to the interim human services committees by December 1, 2024 on their preparations for the repeal of civil commitments for individuals with intellectual disabilities. Additionally, the measure prohibits public bodies from denying services to an individual with a mental illness based on a co-occurring intellectual disability.	
Aside from the reporting requirement for the Department of Human Services, all other provisions become operative July 1, 2025, as a result there is no fiscal impact for the 2023 25 biennium.
