# **Summary of Revenue Changes**

House Bill 4136 directs Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to enter into an agreement with Lane County Public Health (LCPH) to administer moneys appropriated under this measure. The measure appropriates \$4.5 million to OHA, with \$1.3 million to be used for distribution to the City of Eugene for establishment and maintenance of a basic life support unit; and \$3.2 million for a health care access innovation fund.

# <u>Summary of Human Services Subcommittee Action</u>

House Bill 4136 requires OHA to enter into an agreement with LCPH to distribute funds to support a basic life support unit, and innovation in same-day health care in the greater Eugene area.

The measure appropriates \$4.5 million to OHA, with \$1.3 million of this to be used for distributions to the City of Eugene, and \$3.2 million for a health care access innovation fund. Distributions to the City of Eugene are for establishment and maintenance of a basic life support unit, and the remainder is to fund a health care access innovation fund to improve access and decrease costs for same-day health care in the greater Eugene area. Administrative costs for OHA to enter into an agreement with LCPH and to process these payments are anticipated to be minimal. LCPH may withhold a reasonable amount from the funds provided for administrative costs, as agreed to with OHA.
