House Bill 4044

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Emergency Management, General Government, and Veterans for Representative Dacia Grayber)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act tells the DEQ to study risks related to toxic inhalation caused by earthquakes. The DEQ must submit a report on its study to the Legislative Assembly by December 1, 2024. The Act takes effect as soon as it is passed. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.6).

Directs the Department of Environmental Quality to study risks and issues relating to

Directs the Department of Environmental Quality to study risks and issues relating to earthquake-induced toxic inhalation. Requires the department to submit a report on the study to a committee of the Legislative Assembly by December 1, 2024. Authorizes the department to submit recommendations for legislation to the committee by March 1, 2025.

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to seismic hazards; and declaring an emergency.
- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Department of Environmental Quality shall study risks and issues relating to earthquake-induced toxic inhalation. The department may consult, partner or contract with any appropriate entity in carrying out the study. The department and other involved entities may consult with state agencies to define the scope of high-risk facilities for purposes of the study.
 - (2) On or before December 1, 2024, the department shall submit a report on the findings of the study to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly relating to emergency management.
 - (3) On or before March 1, 2025, the department may submit recommendations for legislation to the standing or interim committees of the Legislative Assembly relating to emergency management.
 - SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2024 Act is repealed on January 2, 2026.
 - SECTION 3. This 2024 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2024 Act takes effect on its passage.

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
