

## HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 4128

1 Delete lines 4 through 11 of the printed bill and insert:

2 **“SECTION 1. (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is ap-**  
3 **propriated to the Oregon Business Development Department, for the biennium ending June**  
4 **30, 2025, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$89,727,874, to be deposited into the Special**  
5 **Public Works Fund established in ORS 285B.455 for the purpose of producing water and**  
6 **wastewater infrastructure to support new residential housing in this state.**

7 **“(2) The department shall distribute moneys appropriated under subsection (1) of this**  
8 **section to the following entities in the following amounts:**

9 **“(a) City of Albany: \$2,100,000.**

10 **“(b) City of Amity: \$1,500,000.**

11 **“(c) City of Beaverton: \$3,000,000.**

12 **“(d) City of Burns: \$3,000,000.**

20       “**SECTION 2.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-  
21 priated to the Water Resources Department, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, out of  
22 the General Fund, the amount of \$3,000,000, to be deposited into the Water Well Abandon-  
23 ment, Repair and Replacement Fund established in ORS 537.766 for the purpose of carrying  
24 out the program described in ORS 537.767.

25       “**SECTION 3.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-  
26 priated to the Oregon Business Development Department, for the biennium ending June 30,  
27 2025, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$250,000, for the purpose of carrying out section  
28 4 of this 2024 Act.

29       “**SECTION 4.** (1) The Oregon Business Development Department shall update the Oregon  
30 Infrastructure and Community Facilities Inventory.

31       “(2) In carrying out subsection (1) of this section, the department shall collect data, as  
32 time and resources allow, including but not limited to:

- 33       “(a) Status of projects.
- 34       “(b) Readiness to proceed.
- 35       “(c) Total cost of project and, if applicable, existence of matching funds.
- 36       “(d) Housing production impacts, including constraints on drinking water and wastewater  
37 capacity.
- 38       “(e) Impacts on industrial development.

39       “(3) In carrying out subsection (1) of this section, the department shall consult individ-  
40 uals and entities with relevant knowledge or expertise that are from diverse geographies and  
41 have diverse perspectives, including but not limited to:

- 42       “(a) Eligible Indian tribes as defined in ORS 285C.306.
- 43       “(b) Relevant state agencies, including but not limited to the Department of Environ-  
44 mental Quality and the Oregon Health Authority.
- 45       “(c) A representative of the Regional Solutions Program as described in ORS 284.754.

1       “(d) Organizations representing cities, counties, special districts, economic development  
2 districts and public ports.

3       “(4) The department may hire a staff position, contract with qualified entities or enter  
4 into intergovernmental agreements to carry out this section.

5       “(5) No later than February 15, 2025, the department shall submit a report to the com-  
6 mittees of the Legislative Assembly related to water, in the manner provided in ORS 192.245,  
7 addressing:

8       “(a) The updated Oregon Infrastructure and Community Facilities Inventory.

9       “(b) The actions and resources needed to maintain and improve the Oregon  
10 Infrastructure and Community Facilities Inventory.”.

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
