House Bill 5202

Sponsored by JOINT COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act changes limits on the amounts that agencies may spend for building projects. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.7).

Modifies limits on payment of expenses from specified funds by certain state agencies for capital construction.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to state financial administration; amending sections 1 and 2, chapter 659, Oregon Laws 2021, and section 2, chapter 597, Oregon Laws 2023; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 1, chapter 659, Oregon Laws 2021, as amended by section 1, chapter 112, Oregon Laws 2022, and section 1, chapter 23, Oregon Laws 2023, is amended to read:
