**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 4128**

1 Delete lines 4 through 11 of the printed bill and insert:

2 **“SECTION 1. (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appro-**
3 **priation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Business Development**
4 **Department, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, out of the General**
5 **Fund, the amount of \$91,727,874, to be deposited into the Special Public**
6 **Works Fund established in ORS 285B.455 for the purpose of producing**
7 **water and wastewater infrastructure to support new residential hous-**
8 **ing in this state.**

9 **“(2) The department shall distribute moneys appropriated under**
10 **subsection (1) of this section to the following entities in the following**
11 **amounts:**

8 “SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
9 ation, there is appropriated to the Water Resources Department, for
10 the biennium ending June 30, 2025, out of the General Fund, the
11 amount of \$3,000,000, to be deposited into the Water Well Abandon-
12 ment, Repair and Replacement Fund established in ORS 537.766 for the
13 purpose of carrying out the program described in ORS 537.767.

14 “SECTION 3. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
15 ation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Business Development De-
16 partment, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, out of the General
17 Fund, the amount of \$250,000, for the purpose of carrying out section
18 4 of this 2024 Act.

19 “SECTION 4. (1) The Oregon Business Development Department
20 shall update the Oregon Infrastructure and Community Facilities In-
21 ventory.

22 “(2) In carrying out subsection (1) of this section, the department
23 shall collect data, as time and resources allow, including but not lim-
24 ited to:

25 “(a) Status of projects.

26 “(b) Readiness to proceed.

27 “(c) Total cost of project and, if applicable, existence of matching
28 funds.

29 “(d) Housing production impacts, including constraints on drinking
30 water and wastewater capacity.

1 “(e) Impacts on industrial development.

2 “(3) In carrying out subsection (1) of this section, the department
3 shall consult individuals and entities with relevant knowledge or ex-
4 pertise that are from diverse geographies and have diverse perspec-
5 tives, including but not limited to:

6 “(a) Eligible Indian tribes as defined in ORS 285C.306.

7 “(b) Relevant state agencies, including but not limited to the De-
8 partment of Environmental Quality and the Oregon Health Authority.

9 “(c) A representative of the Regional Solutions Program as de-
10 scribed in ORS 284.754.

11 “(d) Organizations representing cities, counties, special districts,
12 economic development districts and public ports.

13 “(4) The department may hire a staff position, contract with quali-
14 fied entities or enter into intergovernmental agreements to carry out
15 this section.

16 “(5) No later than February 15, 2025, the department shall submit
17 a report to the committees of the Legislative Assembly related to wa-
18 ter, in the manner provided in ORS 192.245, addressing:

19 “(a) The updated Oregon Infrastructure and Community Facilities
20 Inventory.

21 “(b) The actions and resources needed to maintain and improve the
22 Oregon Infrastructure and Community Facilities Inventory.”.

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
