Firstly, it would streamline the scheduling process, reducing administrative burdens and ensuring more efficient allocation of interpreter services. By eliminating the need to coordinate through language companies, hospitals, courts, and any location would have greater flexibility in scheduling interpreters based on their specific language skills and availability.

Furthermore, direct payment from the state would provide interpreters with more transparency and control over their compensation. Currently, interpreters often receive only a fraction of the fees charged by language companies, despite being the ones delivering the services. Direct payment would enable interpreters to receive fair and timely compensation for their vital work, thereby enhancing job satisfaction and retention rates within the profession.
