Salem Capital Pride appreciates the opportunity to submit the following testimony against House Bill

4086.

Salem Capital Pride seeks to elevate the voices of the LGBTQIA+ and other minority communities

in the central Willamette Valley and provide opportunities for the promotion of and advocacy for

those communities and our allies.

Salem Capital Pride is in opposition of this bill because the bill seeks to limit the scope of investigation

of child abuse based on the child abuse suspect's relationship with or access to the suspected abused

child.

It is the belief of Salem Capital Pride that no such limitation should exist as listed in section 1(11) to

ensure that those who are perpetrators of child abuse or suspected perpetrators of child abuse are all

investigated regardless of their relationship with and access to the suspected abused child. It is our

concern that such limitations may inadvertently result in the perpetrator or suspected perpetrator of

child abuse going free.

Salem Capital Pride urges the committee to remove section 1(11) from this bill.
