I live by an inner city park, rampant and debilitating drug use - deadly drug use has skyrocketed since Measure 110 was adopted. I am against weak and unacceptable changes to Measure 110 and in support of stronger changes that will save lives and rescue communities.

HB 4002 repeats the flaw of Measure 110 – no deterrent to use hard drugs and not enough time (15-30 days) to get someone off addictive drugs like fentanyl. HB 4002 must reclassify possession of hard drugs as a Class A misdemeanor crime – not the lowest level Class C as is being proposed. Drug treatment must be a mandatory alternative to jail – the voluntary approach under Measure 110 has failed. Lawmakers should listen to Oregon law enforcement who support a Class A misdemeanor and reject the national drug legalization lobbyists defending Measure 110 - they are ideologues supporting DEATH for citizens.
