Living a life bereft of options is unhealthy at best, and too often is ruinous. Oregon is a dog-loving state. Do the right thing and confirm your love and respect for dogs by OUTLAWING gambling related to greyhounds and other dogs. By doing this, you can help make sure that greyhounds' lives are not contingent upon 'what have you done for me lately,' and you further affirm that ours is a culture of dogs as family members, not as ATMs that get destroyed when they stop spitting out money on demand.
