Oregon already has one of the highest states in the country, taking into account their lower population numbers. Oregon also collects millions in taxes that thanks to the "kicker" they are forced to return to taxpayers. Since moving to this state, I have been shocked by how the Oregon legislature imposes a tax for a specific purpose and enacts it after a "yes" vote, but then allocates the funds for another purpose without a vote! I also dislike how this legislature tries to "push" measures without consideration as to how their poor planning would adversely affect vulnerable neighborhoods (I am speaking about Vote Before Tolls initiative, which I strongly support).
