Oregon's Employment Department finally installed new computers and systems after receiving federal funding 15 years ago. There is also a proposed \$500 million housing project that will also increase taxes, something many, especially low-income homeowners, cannot afford.

Second, property taxes are already high. Even though Oregon ranks in the middle of the pack country-wide, there are also local taxes and levies. My city is still paying for Rogue Community College bonds and Rogue Valley Transportation levies. We are also paying for our local law enforcement and fire districts.
