We are in a crisis of need for substance abuse assistance and psychiatric help, the lack of which is driving much of the homelessness, addiction, and crime in Oregon. A Certificate of Need increases costs because it increases the barriers to start-ups and innovators while at the same time protects existing facilities from competition. CON consolidates power for health decisions with the large players in the industry and State regulators which may have goals or an agenda that is contrary to quality care, low cost, and facility availability and location.
