Immediately after the fires were set, "experts" and the news began reporting climate change as the major cause. I live in southwest Oregon. We have very hot, dry summers with dry electrical storms, some years more frequent than others. This is not new. This is not related to climate change. We live in a fire dependent ecosystem that has been here so long that we have multiple species of pyrophytic plants. These are plants that require fire to release their seeds or to reproduce. The only thing that has changed with regard to wildfire is the elimination of smokejumpers and spotters that put fires out as soon as they started. This was cheap and effective. It was and still is necessary in second growth forests. Now, fires are ignored until they are unstoppable and millions are spent trying to contain them until nature can put them out. This not only releases more carbon into the air that climate alarmists worry about, but eliminates nature's carbon scrubbers in the process: trees and plants. Equally disastrous is the one size fits all forest management program. Over thinning the canopy of second growth forests in hot dry regions causes spot specific drought, stressing trees and inviting beetle infestation.
