As City Manager of the City of Nehalem, I would like to provide my support for -3 Recreational Immunity Fix Amendment to SB 1576.

As you may be aware our quaint little city is located on the coast and surrounded by rivers, trails, and beaches which makes us and our surrounding cities an outdoor recreation destination which also helps boost our city's tourism economies.

Trails and access to nature and outdoor recreation provide so many benefits to individuals, families, and communities in general including physical fitness, health benefits, mental health benefits, and connection to and appreciation for nature. It also provides an inexpensive opportunity that everyone should be able to openly enjoy.

It is important to restore recreational immunity to encourage landowners to keep trails, especially trails providing access to beaches and other recreational areas, open to the public without fearing the real risk of lawsuits and/or being able to no longer afford to keep their trails and lands open to the public.

Please pass SB 1576-3 with language that clearly restores recreational immunity for public and private landowners and clearly applies to both improved and unimproved trails.
