## Regarding SB 1583:

**I oppose SB 1583**. Senate Bill 1583 infringes on local control of public education and limits parents' rights to guide their children's education in accordance with their values and beliefs.

School boards play a crucial role in representing the values and preferences of local constituents. Mandating specific content requirements for textbooks and instructional materials undermines the authority of school boards to make informed decisions that best serve the needs of their students and communities.

Furthermore, Senate Bill 1583 limits parents' rights to guide their children's education in accordance with their values and beliefs.
