I urge the Committee to reject HB 4024-3.

The method by which -3 was developed was not open to public scrutiny. A proposal to fix a problem of this magnitude deserves far more input, and far greater transparency.

*Annual legislative sessions of an adequate length to give serious consideration to, and develop solutions for, the problems of a state with a biennial budget of tens of billions of

dollars.
