Dear Chair Lieber, Vice-Chair Kropf, and Members of the Committee,

The Metropolitan Mayors' Consortium represents the mayors of twenty-four cities in the Portland Metro Area, collectively home to over 1.7 million Oregonians. We are writing to express our support for House Bill 4002 with the -24 amendment, aimed at addressing the deeply rooted addiction crisis in our local communities.

Drug-related crime, overdose deaths, and the related public health crisis has shaken our communities. We believe that penalties, coupled with increased access to treatment and rehabilitation services, are the most effective way to address the present crisis. This approach will reduce the acceptance of fentanyl use, protect vulnerable populations from exploitation, and ultimately improve public safety and health outcomes for all.

This approach will not work without sufficient behavior health and treatment resources. HB 4002 with the -24 amendment would allow us to shift our approach to a multifaceted approach that weaves sanctions with treatment to provide the support that those in crisis need. The approach embodied in HB 4002 (-24) moves Oregon towards a public health methodology, rather than punitive or non-interventive approaches. This will lead to better outcomes and create a safer, healthier, and more compassionate community for all.
