Chair Patterson, Vice Chair Hayden, and members of the committee, my name is Carrie Baldwin-Sayre and I am a naturopathic physician (ND). Thank you for the opportunity to write today on behalf of the Oregon Association of Naturopathic Physicians (OANP) supporting HB 4130A. I am the Associate Vice President of Advancement at the National University of Natural Medicine, past-president of the OANP and a current member of the OANP legislative advocacy committee. There are over 1,100 licensed naturopathic physicians in the state of Oregon, and they practice in large and small private clinics, in hospital systems, in federally-qualified health centers, in urban and rural areas, and in academic medical centers.

As naturopathic physicians, we are inherently patient-centered, and our core tenant is to treat the whole person. We do this with an excellent safety record and high level of quality. Certainly, the high cost of medical care is a significant stressor for patients, and NDs must be particularly cognizant of this since many have moved to cash-based practices due to a lack of pay parity in insurance reimbursement with nearly all other practitioners.

The growing involvement of private equity in healthcare raises important concerns. Many studies have now shown that costs to patients are often increased, and quality of care often decreases. There is also concern that the closed nature of these investments makes it difficult to monitor practices and ensure patient well-being is prioritized. These outcomes represent the opposite of the patient-centered, whole-person healthcare that naturopathic physicians practice.

HB 4130A will strengthen existing regulation around corporatization of healthcare and will help to prevent increased costs to patients and worsening of the quality of care.
