I am in support of HB 4002, because Oregon has seen a staggering increase in fentanyl deaths, the highest in the nation. This is deeply personal, as we lost our 17-year-old grandson to an "acute fentanyl poisoning" in summer 2023. He had completed an inpatient program successfully, his GED in record time and had a promising future in forensics at the local community college where he was enrolled for last fall. This is a deeply tragic loss to our family. Many months following his death I was downtown to attempt taking my two young grandsons shopping at Pioneer Square. As we walked, I clearly saw open drug use and the sad state of the city. We later went with another family member to a concert at the Old Church. When our family member was outside the door taking a cigarette break, she was approached by a drug dealer. This is a sad state of a city I once was so proud to live in. I strongly support the following:

- ?? Support HB 4002 to recriminalize hard drugs with up to 6 months in jail or mandatory, supervised drug treatment.
- ?? Support HB 4002 to replace voluntary drug treatment with required evidence-based treatment as an alternative to jail.
- ?? Support HB 4002 to give local governments the tools to ban the use of drugs in public and police and prosecutors stronger tools to go after drug dealers and traffickers.
- ?? Support HB 4002 backed by law enforcement, cities, counties, local businesses, Democrats, Republicans and 73% of Oregonians.

Measure 110 didn't create Oregon's addiction and overdose, homeless, mental health, and public safety crisis – but it's making all of them worse.
