This bill as written will limit free speech through limiting the average citizens contributions to the candidate of their choice and give the rich and more organized groups a larger contribution voice. Unlimited donations from the party institutions would require more loyalty to the party over loyalty to the voters.

This proposal supercharges the biggest corporations and entities in allowing them to spend vastly more than everyone else, dominating the political landscape.
