SB 1583 is a bill that presumes localities are discriminatory and that the Oregon legislature needs to protect children from the parents within communities.

It assumes that books are equally appropriate for every level of K-12 education, which is entirely contrary to what is understood of childhood development. What an average high school student understands as a difference between fact and opinion is quite different than the understanding of the less cognitively developed 5 year old.
