**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 1531**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 28 and delete page
2 2.

3 On page 3, delete lines 1 through 14 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. (1) The America 250 Oregon Commission is estab-**
5 **lished, consisting of 27 members appointed as provided in subsection**
6 **(2) of this section.**

7 **“(2)(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint two nonvoting**
8 **members from among members of the Senate, one from the majority**
9 **party and one from the minority party.**

10 **“(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two**
11 **nonvoting members from among members of the House of Represen-**
12 **tatives, one from the majority party and one from the minority party.**

13 **“(c) The Governor shall appoint 13 voting members as follows:**

14 **“(A) One member representing the Oregon Heritage Commission.**

15 **“(B) One member representing the Oregon Arts Commission.**

16 **“(C) One member representing the Trust for Cultural Development**
17 **Board.**

18 **“(D) One member representing the Commission on Black Affairs.**

19 **“(E) One member representing the Commission on Asian and**
20 **Pacific Islander Affairs.**

21 **“(F) One member representing the Commission on Hispanic Affairs.**

- 1 **“(G) One member representing the Commission for Women.**
- 2 **“(H) Six members representing the public at large.**
- 3 **“(d) The following 10 voting members shall serve ex officio:**
- 4 **“(A) The Executive Director of the Oregon Historical Society or the**
5 **executive director’s designee.**
- 6 **“(B) The State Treasurer or the treasurer’s designee.**
- 7 **“(C) The Secretary of State or the secretary’s designee.**
- 8 **“(D) The Deputy Superintendent of Public Instruction or the deputy**
9 **superintendent’s designee.**
- 10 **“(E) The State Parks and Recreation Director or the director’s**
11 **designee.**
- 12 **“(F) The Director of the Oregon Business Development Department**
13 **or the director’s designee.**
- 14 **“(G) The executive director of the Oregon Tourism Commission or**
15 **the executive director’s designee.**
- 16 **“(H) The Director of Veterans’ Affairs or the director’s designee.**
- 17 **“(I) The Governor’s director of tribal affairs or the director’s**
18 **designee.**
- 19 **“(J) The Executive Officer of the Commission on Indian Services**
20 **or the executive officer’s designee.**
- 21 **“(e) The America 250 Oregon Commission may by majority vote in-**
22 **vite additional individuals to serve as nonvoting honorary members**
23 **of the commission.**
- 24 **“(f) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority**
25 **shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.**
- 26 **“(3) The commission shall:**
- 27 **“(a) Coordinate and provide guidance for Oregon’s official**
28 **observance of the 250th anniversary of the establishment of the United**
29 **States, as marked by the Declaration of Independence in 1776.**
- 30 **“(b) Consult with the nine federally recognized Indian tribes in**

1 Oregon when planning and developing activities throughout the state
2 in order to meaningfully include Oregon’s tribal history.

3 “(c) Seek to ensure an official observance that is inclusive and
4 shares the histories of Oregon’s diverse populations, including the
5 histories of the Native American peoples who have an ancestral and
6 tradition connection to this state.

7 “(4) The commission may:

8 “(a) Adopt rules necessary for the operation of the commission;

9 “(b) Cooperate with national, regional, state, local and Native
10 American organizations, institutions, bodies and other public or pri-
11 vate entities that are promoting the semiquincentennial;

12 “(c) Plan, conduct and assist with semiquincentennial events;

13 “(d) Plan, support and produce educational resources and programs
14 related to the semiquincentennial;

15 “(e) Engage in and encourage fundraising activities, including, but
16 not limited to, the solicitation of charitable gifts, grants or donations;

17 “(f) Coordinate interagency participation in the observance;

18 “(g) Create subcommittees of the commission comprising members
19 of the commission, members appointed from the public at large and
20 honorary members to further the goals of the commission; and

21 “(h) Engage in any other activity related to the powers and duties
22 conferred on the commission under this section.

23 “(5) The commission shall meet at times and places specified by the
24 call of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the
25 commission.

26 “(6) A majority of the voting members of the commission consti-
27 tutes a quorum for the transaction of business.

28 “(7) Official action by the commission requires the approval of a
29 majority of the voting members of the commission.

30 “(8) The Executive Director of the Oregon Historical Society or the

1 executive director's designee shall serve as chairperson.

2 “(9) The Oregon Historical Society shall:

3 “(a) Provide staff support to the commission.

4 “(b) Direct and supervise the budgeting, recordkeeping, reporting
5 and related administrative and clerical functions of the commission.

6 “(c) Print and disseminate for the commission any required notices,
7 rules or orders adopted by the commission.

8 “(d) Expend and allocate any appropriations authorized by the
9 Legislative Assembly to carry out the purposes of this section.

10 “(e) Collect all revenues other than those appropriated by the Leg-
11 islative Assembly and use them for the purposes of this section.

12 “(10) The Oregon Historical Society may employ personnel, contract
13 for services and receive, expend and allocate the proceeds of gifts,
14 grants and donations on behalf of the commission for the purposes of
15 this section.

16 “(11) Voting members of the commission are entitled to compen-
17 sation and expenses as provided in ORS 292.495.

18 “(12) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111,
19 are directed to assist the commission in the performance of the duties
20 of the commission and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to
21 confidentiality, to furnish information and advice that the members
22 of the commission consider necessary to perform their duties.

23 “(13) No later than September 15 of each year, the commission shall
24 submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245 to the interim
25 committees of the Legislative Assembly related to historical com-
26 memorations. The report may include recommendations for legis-
27 lation.

28 “SECTION 1a. Section 1b of this 2024 Act is added to and made a
29 part of ORS 172.100 to 172.140.

30 “SECTION 1b. (1) The America 250 Oregon Subcommittee is estab-

1 lished within the Commission on Indian Services.

2 “(2) The purpose of the subcommittee is to provide coordination and
3 guidance to the America 250 Oregon Commission established under
4 section 1 of this 2024 Act.

5 “(3) The subcommittee shall consist of 10 members as follows:

6 “(a) The Executive Officer of the Commission on Indian Services
7 shall appoint the following nine voting members:

8 “(A) One member representing the Burns-Paiute Tribe.

9 “(B) One member representing the Confederated Coos, Lower
10 Umpqua and Siuslaw Tribes.

11 “(C) One member representing the Confederated Tribes of the
12 Grand Ronde.

13 “(D) One member representing the Confederated Tribes of Siletz
14 Indians of Oregon.

15 “(E) One member representing the Confederated Tribes of the
16 Umatilla Indian Reservation.

17 “(F) One member representing the Confederated Tribes of the
18 Warm Springs Indian Reservation.

19 “(G) One member representing the Coquille Tribe.

20 “(H) One member representing the Cow Creek Band of Umpqua In-
21 dians.

22 “(I) One member representing the Klamath Tribe.

23 “(b) One nonvoting member who is the Executive Officer of the
24 Commission on Indian Services or the executive officer’s designee
25 serving ex officio on the America 250 Oregon Commission under sec-
26 tion 1 (2)(d)(J) of this 2024 Act.

27 “(4) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the executive officer shall
28 make an appointment to become immediately effective.

29 “(5) The role of the nonvoting member described in subsection (3)(b)
30 of this section is to:

1 “(a) Serve as the liaison of the subcommittee to the America 250
2 Oregon Commission.

3 “(b) Communicate the positions of the nine federally recognized
4 Indian tribes in Oregon to the America 250 Oregon Commission in or-
5 der to uplift the tribes’ histories and stories.

6 “(6) The subcommittee may elect one of its members to serve as
7 chairperson.

8 “(7) The subcommittee shall meet at times and places specified by
9 the call of the chairperson or a majority of the voting members of the
10 subcommittee.

11 “(8) A majority of the voting members of the subcommittee consti-
12 tutes a quorum for the transaction of business.

13 “(9) Official action by the subcommittee requires the approval of a
14 majority of the voting members of the subcommittee.

15 “(10) The subcommittee may adopt rules necessary for the operation
16 of the subcommittee.

17 “SECTION 2. Sections 1 and 1b of this 2024 Act are repealed on
18 January 2, 2028.”

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
