

\$15,808


Annual price of home-based care in Oregon

### How Early Care & Education is Funded




#### Child Care & Development

**Fund** ACF authorizes child care assistance for low-income families, and for infrastructure, such as licensing, workforce and quality improvement

**Families** pay providers or programs tuition

State funds early learning and care for some families and contributes resources for quality improvement and other supports



#### **Head Start**


ACF authorizes and funds directly 24 grantees in Oregon, and provides monitoring and technical assistance

#### **Programmatic Supports**

Other agencies receive federal funding for ECE (ODHS, OHA, ODE, etc.), e.g. Early Learning Hubs, Relief Nurseries, Home Visiting, etc.








Early Learning Workforce

Data include citizen, non-elderly adult (19-64) workers who identified as childcare workers according to ACS occupation codes. States without data suppressed due to poor reliability.



**ECE Foundations** 

Federal Requirements



- **70%** for direct services for low-income families
- 9% for improving quality infrastructure
- 3% focused on infants & toddlers
- No more than 5% may be used for administrative costs

- 26,000 children
- Employment Related Day Care
- Baby Promise



**Direct Services** 

Federally authorized



- 65% discretionary funding (subject to change)
- 35% mandatory funding (permanent)



# Head Start & Oregon Prenatal to Kindergarten (OPK)



### **Head Start Funding in Oregon**

Head Start - \$117.7M/annual	Oregon Prenatal to Kindergarten - \$364M/biennium
Federal to Local – US Dept. of Health and Human Services to Grantees	State to Local – Oregon Department of Early Learning and Care to Grantees
24 local grantees	30 local grantees (including 24 Head Start)
5,182 slots	7,431 slots
Infrastructure – facilities, classroom materials, school buses	

80% of OPK sites are dually funded, offering slots for children eligible for both Head Start + OPK.


Federal staff currently provide monitoring and technical assistance to all dual-funded Head Start/OPK sites.

# Head Start Impacts: Closure of Region X

	Region West – Current State	Region X – Prior to April 1st
Service Area	Serving AK, ID, OR, WA, HI, CO, MT, UT, WY, KS, CA, NV, NE, Islands of Palau, Guam, and Commonwealth of Northern Mariana Islands	Served Washington, Oregon, Idaho & Alaska
Regional Staff Support	Federal staff with the OHS West contracted staff are assigned to all grantees. Caseload sizes tripled.	Program, Fiscal, and Grant specialists assigned to each grantee. Regular meetings, communication & support.
OHS Central Office Oversight	OHS Central Office has oversight over all other supports for Grant Recipients such as Fiscal/Budget needs and/or approvals.	RX was responsible for program guidance, direct support, grant oversight, funding distribution, program monitoring and compliance to Grant Recipients.
Communications	Communication with the OHS is through the identified Grantee Systems or through a universal email address.	Region X staff served as the ambassadors and communication conduit between grantees & OHS Central Office
