




- 1 Sunset of residential tax credit changed from 2035 to **December 2025**

OREGON SOLAR FOR ALL

Potential Losses for Oregon:

- \$86.6 M in total federal grant funding
- 1,800 solar installations on low-income single-family homes losing \$40 M+ in lifetime savings
- Solar installations serving 2,000 multi-family homes losing \$48 M+ in lifetime savings
- 37 megawatts of community solar projects affecting more than 4,000 households
- \$2.87 M in workforce development activities
- Partnerships and trust with many regional partners
