Employment Relations Board

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Employment Relations Board Overview

The Employment Relations Board (1) administers the collective bargaining law that covers public employers and their employees, which includes the State of Oregon, cities, counties, school districts, police, fire, and other local government entities; (2) assists public employers and employees in resolving labor disputes through mediation, interest-based bargaining and problem- solving training and facilitation; (3) hears and decides appeals from certain non-union state employees concerning personnel actions; and (4) administers the collective bargaining law for private sector employers and their employees who are not covered by the National Labor Relations Act. The public policy underlying these laws is to promote workplace stability and reduce workplace disputes that may disrupt public services, which benefits all Oregonians by ensuring that the public will continue to receive high-quality public services without impairment or interruption. The agency's services allow public employers and their employees to resolve workplace disputes faster, more efficiently, and less expensively than they could by litigating disagreements through court proceedings.

Agency Approach to Developing and Prioritizing Reduction Options While Maintaining Core Programs and Services

With agency caseloads at extremely high levels, as well as the increase in high-conflict bargaining disputes, the agency prioritized ensuring that we could best achieve our legislative key performance measures. We also prioritized ensuring adequate staffing so that our constituents (and the public) would continue to receive necessary services. As an agency with a budget comprised of 85.5 percent personal services, attempting to achieve these sorts of reductions is extremely difficult. We have achieved some of the requested reductions by delaying the hiring of a mediator, even though that position is sorely needed. Our reductions also would ultimately mean that our mediators and Administrative Law Judges would no longer be able to travel, which would dramatically affect our constituents, as we are an agency that generally travels to provide services to our constituents and the public throughout the state. These reductions would also result in depleting our services and supplies budget, which is likewise not sustainable, and would impair our ability to operate. As a quasijudicial independent agency with exclusive jurisdiction over public sector collective bargaining, we do not have programs or services that are duplicative across the state.
