Criteria Used to Select Reduction Options

- Proportionality between housing production (40%) and non-housing programs (60%)
 - DLCD's mission reaches broadly across land use issues and priority outcomes
 - Even with reductions, continue to assist local governments to update housing plans and support housing production
 - Even with reductions, maintain critical capacity to support the work of the Commission, retain appropriate operational controls, and resolve major land use issues
 - Note: Non-housing programs contribute to land readiness for housing production and other land use issues
 - (Reducing staff could lead to unintended impacts to housing policy and outcomes)









Criteria Used to Select Reduction Options

- Preserve <u>existing</u> programs and staff
 - Minimize impacts on field work (technical assistance to local partners)
 - Local partners benefit from DLCD expertise & knowledge of the policy and context of Oregon land use
 - Local partners benefit from direct technical assistance and technical assistance grants
 - Maintain appropriate controls in central business operations
 - Preserve match contributions to leverage federal funding



Criteria Used to Select Reduction Options

- Account for already existing budget constraints
 - DLCD is holding five positions (in addition to reduction options items) vacant to meet:
 - Vacancy factor reduction assessed in the 2025-27 Legislatively Adopted Budget
 - Expected costs of the bargained one-time Workday payroll transition payment
 - Due to federal funding losses coming in 2026, DLCD is facing reduction of up to six federal-funded positions


Process Used to Evaluate against Criteria

- Proposed reductions are proportionate between housing production and non-housing programs
 - Proposed reductions proportions are based on proportions of the department budget
 - Proposed reductions preserve grant funding and staff to share direct technical expertise
 - Local partners have shared how they are stretched beyond capacity and request significant support

- Proposed reductions are designed to preserve existing programs and staff
 - First two items focus on newly authorized (2025), still-vacant, limited duration positions
 - Existing staff positions are not included until the last item

General Fund Reduction Themes

- One-time, except for the last item
 - Newly authorized unfilled limited duration positions
 - Technical assistance grant funding minimal
 - Operational services and supplies
 - Housing policy and production <u>support</u> projects, with onetime funding
- Last item includes permanent staff positions
 - Before enacting, DLCD requests final opportunity to identify newly emerged cost savings to use instead



DLCD's Plan to Minimize Impact

- DLCD can continue to make progress on most programs, except for shoreline stabilization rulemaking
- Technical assistance items preserve grant funding for local partners
- Housing policy and production support projects can still be successfully completed
 - Housing outcomes tracking development
 - Housing Accountability and Production Office prescribed analysis and report (SB 1537, 2024)
 - Middle Housing code development and rulemaking
