
- Fuel Transportation – 5 granted

- High Axle Rescue Water Evacuation Vehicle – 3 granted




SPIRE Dashboard – Equipment available across Oregon

Highly portable and versatile communications equipment, maintained to modern security and functionality standards.




Statewide Search and Rescue Coordination
