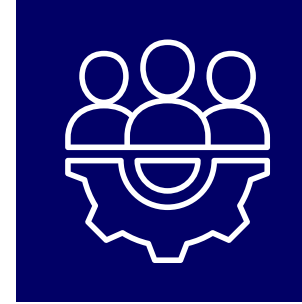

2025 FIRE SEASON

- 1,160 fires on ODF-protected land burning about 25,000 acres
 - 94% of ODF fires kept at 10 acres or less
- 3,756+ response calls
- Six complex incident management team deployments
- NW Compact & state-to-state agreements

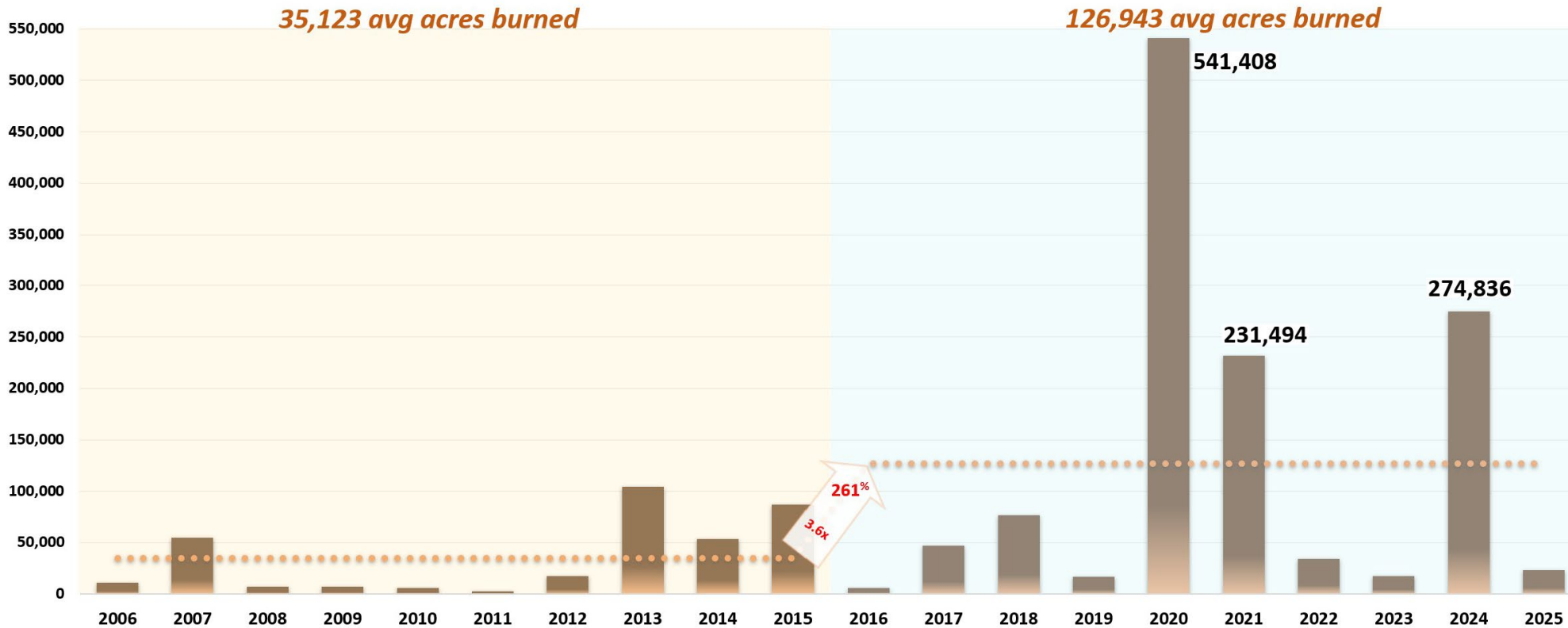

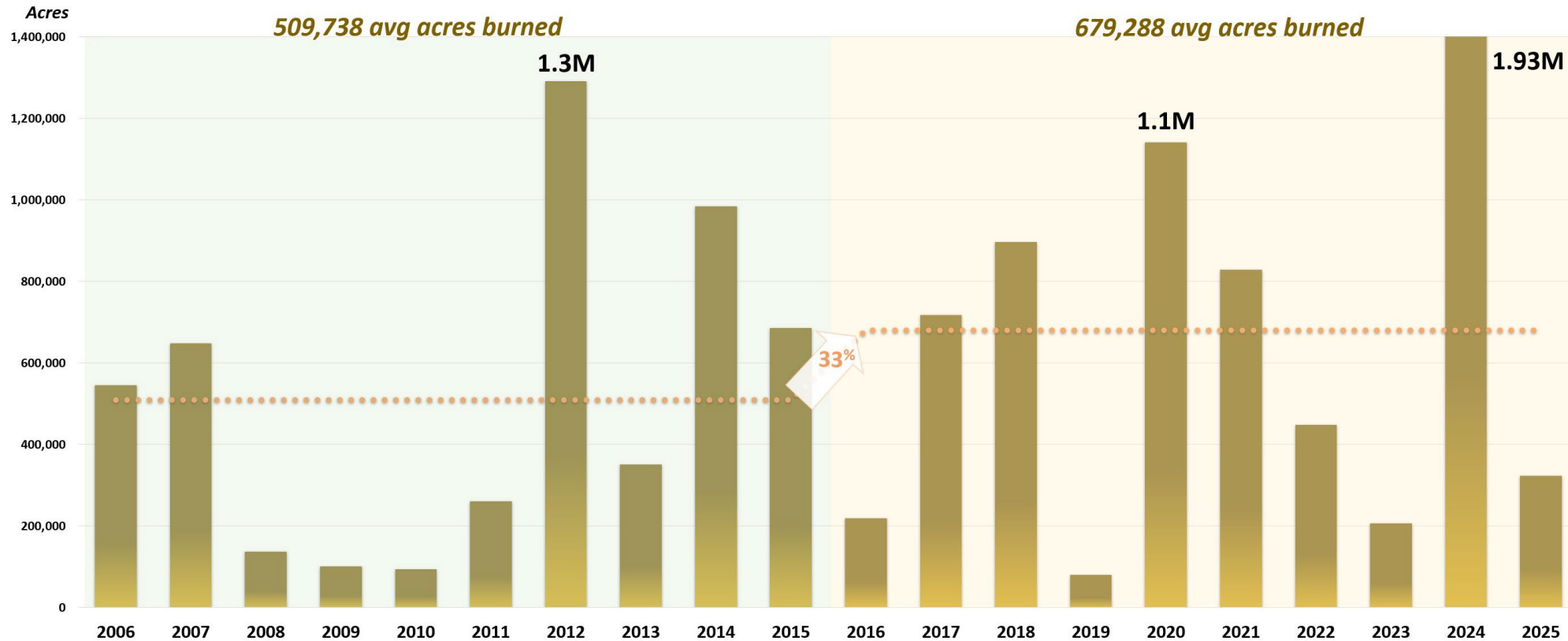
ACRES BURNED – ODF PROTECTION

ACRES BURNED – ALL JURISDICTIONS

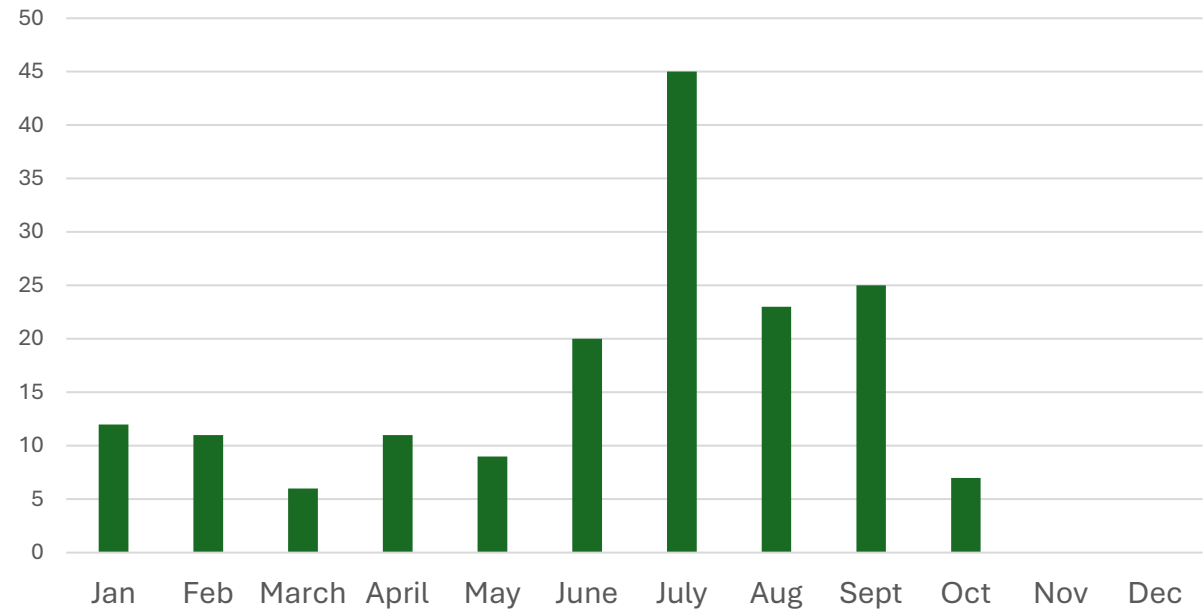

Safety Incidents, YTD by Month



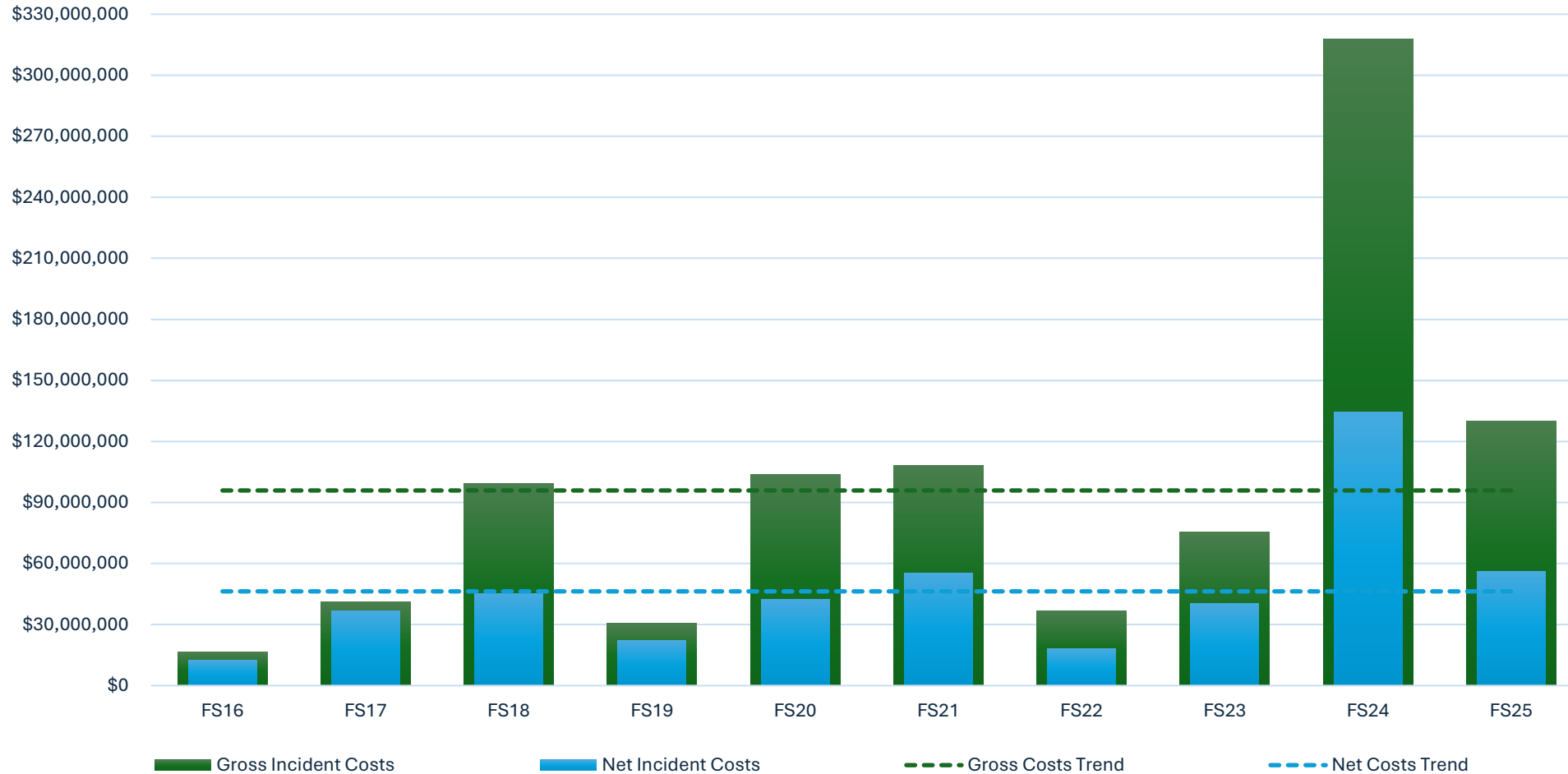
Most common safety issues—injuries and vehicle incidents

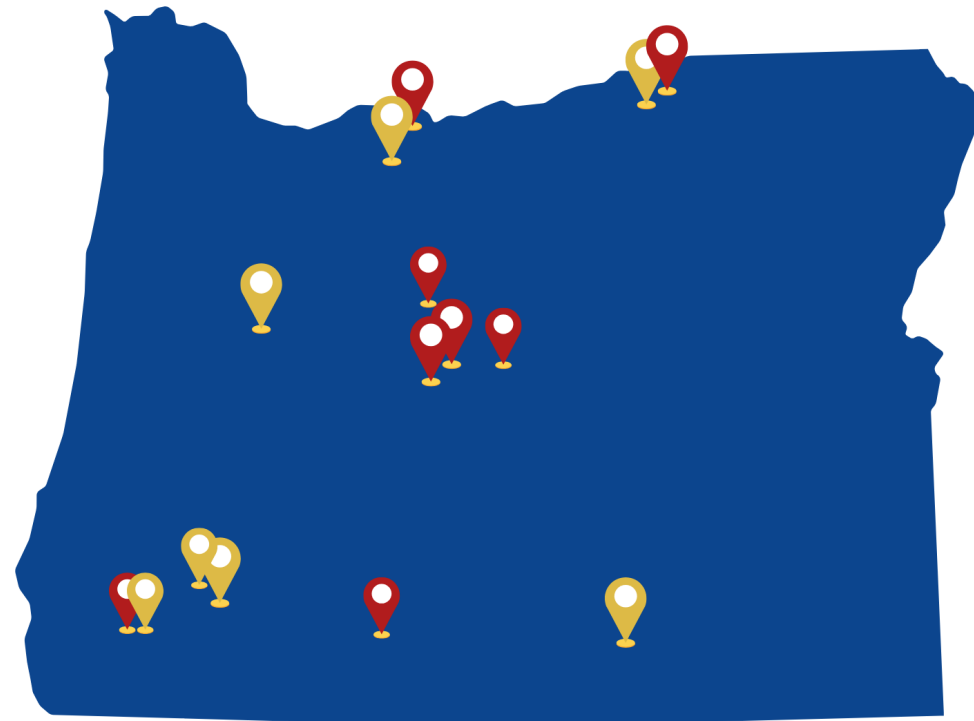

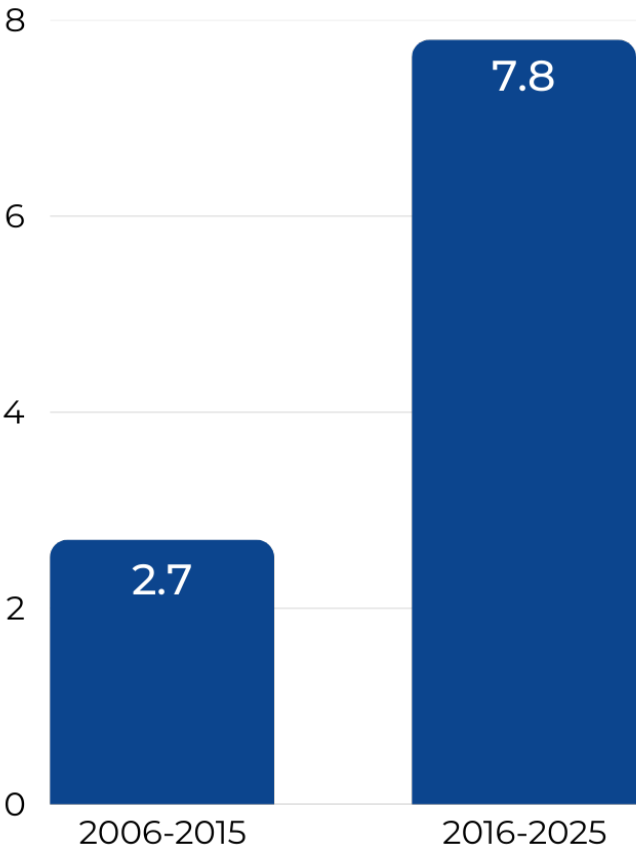

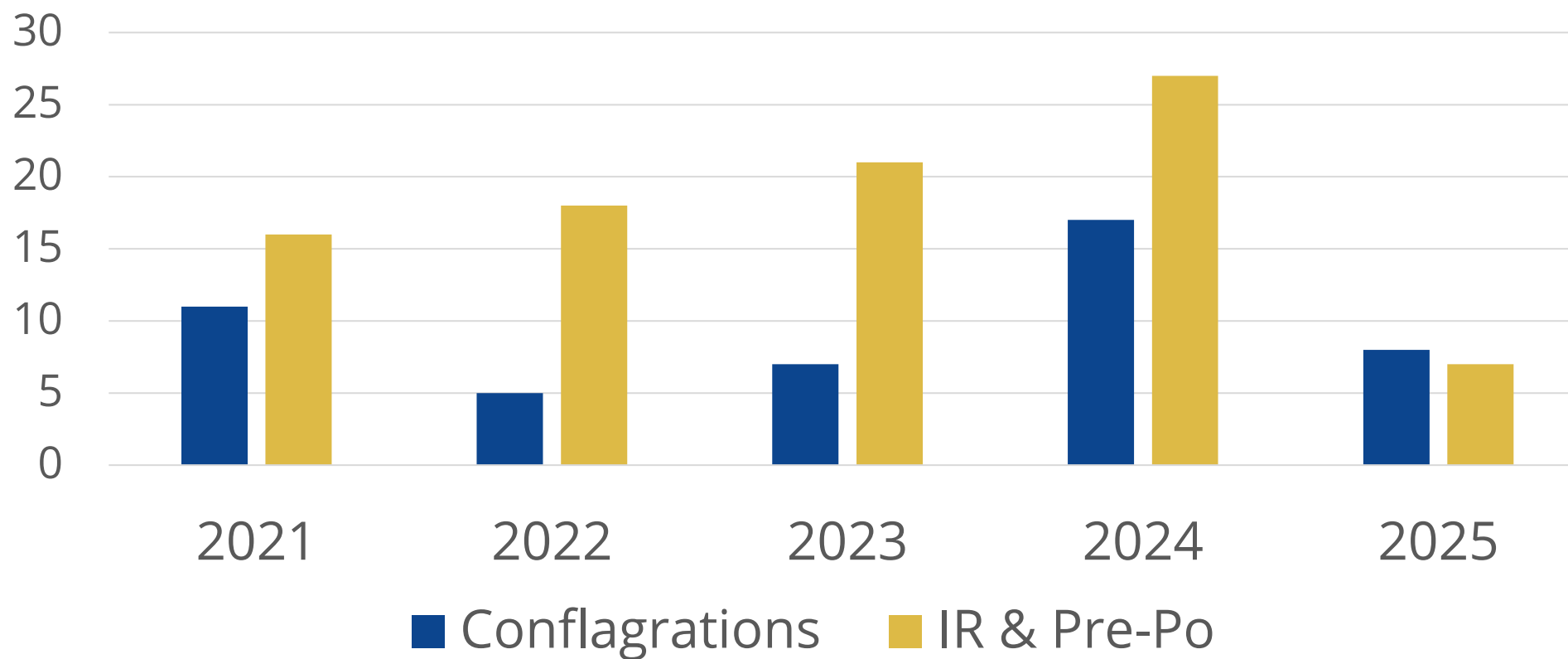


CONFLAGRATION 20-YEAR AVERAGE

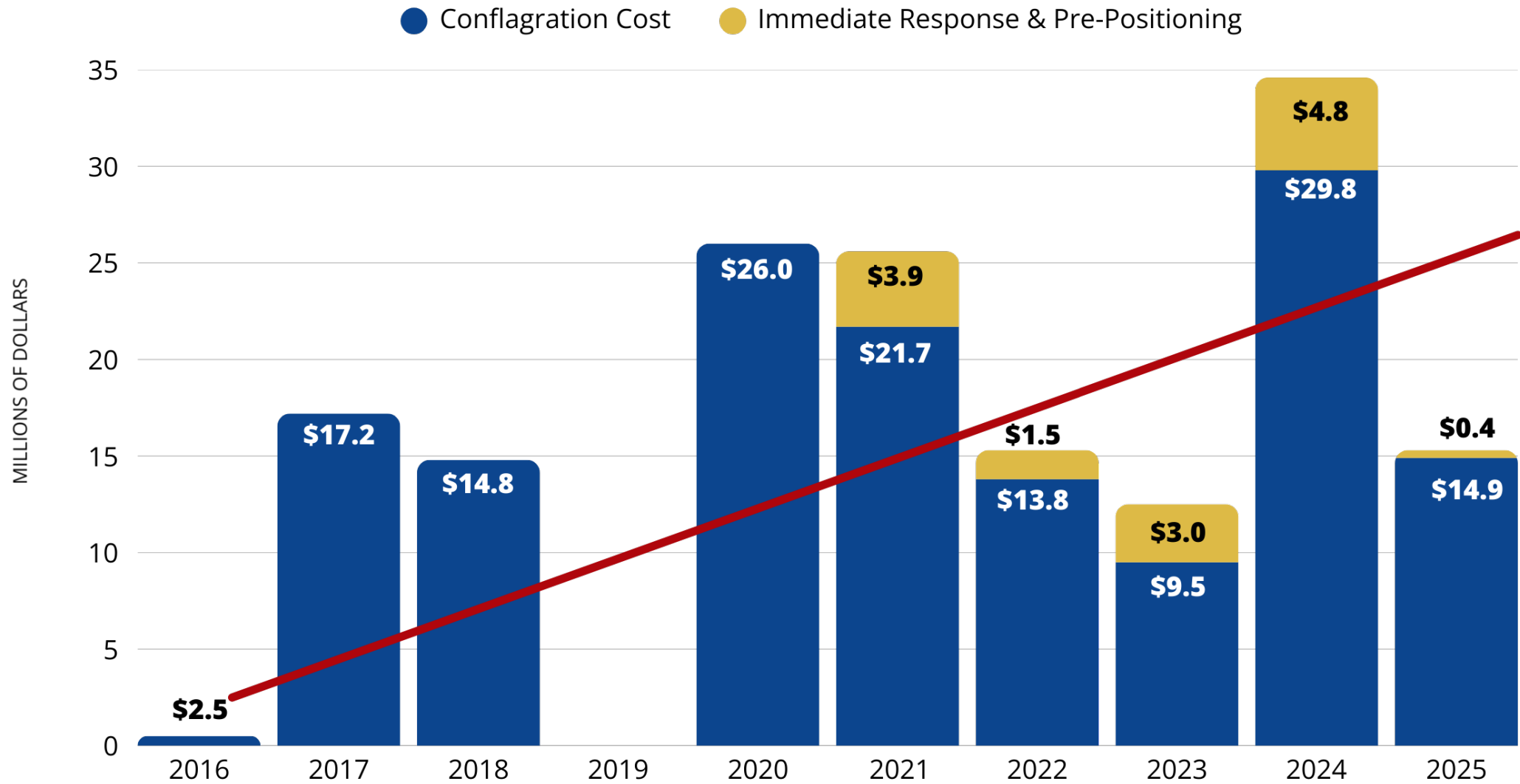
