#### Our Guiding Mission



# Expand Opportunity

Use AI to expand opportunities for all students, especially those with disabilities, enhancing communication and creativity.



#### **Ensure Fair Access**

Provide fair and equitable access to age-appropriate Al tools for everyone within our learning community.



#### **Empower Teachers**

Empower teachers to use Al as a helpful, innovative tool for differentiation and workflow, not as a replacement.

## The Background: The 'How'

#### Our Policy Journey

#### 2023: Develop Guidance

Drafted, reviewed, and adopted clear Administrative Rules for responsible use and integrity.

### Ongoing: Annual Review

Committed to an annual committee review to keep policies relevant and effective.

#### 2022: Form Committee(s)

Convened a diverse team of educators, staff, and tech experts to study AI's impact.

#### 2024: Adopt Policy

Implemented the "AI Guide for Educators" based on adopted policies, IIBG & IKI

#### Our Policy Foundation

#### IIBG-AR: Responsible Use

This rule defines AI and Generative AI, setting the foundation for ethical, responsible, and safe use of all technology.

#### IKI-AR: Academic Integrity

This rule redefines integrity to include the "thoughtful integration" of AI, focusing on citation and student process.

## **Practical Guidance: The 'What'**

#### The AI Use Stoplight

Red Light: Unauthorized Use

Using AI would defeat the purpose of the task and would result in academic dishonesty.


- Work should be completely original
- Al should not be used at any point.

#### Green Light: Authorized Use

Represents responsible, thoughtful use.

- Brainstorming ideas, outlines or research questions
- Using AI as an accessibility tool (ie translation, text-to-speech)
- Strategic feedback on writing example.


### Our View on Academic Integrity (IKI-AR)



Our policy (IKI-AR) explicitly states AI detectors are \*not\* substantial evidence. We focus on a restorative approach, prioritizing student discussion and process.
