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OHA Implementation: Civil Commitment

- OARs: Temporary and permanent rule process underway
- Overhaul of forms used by Community Mental Health Programs(CMHPs) and Oregon Judicial Department (OJD) to meet requirements of HB 2005
- Examiner and Investigator certification training updates
- Hospital engagement to educate and problem solve
- Planning for outreach to impacted system partners

OHA Implementation: Aid and Assist

- OARs: Rule revisions and permanent rule process underway
- Form development
- CMHP training development
- Streamline data points to reduce administrative burden

Challenges Impacting OHA and System Partners

- Increased administrative burden
- Gaps in training, shared language and information sharing
- Greater responsibilities and oversight placed on OHA and system partners, with no added resources

HB 2005 Workgroup

- Opportunity to bring system partners together, including representation from OJD, District Attorney, CMHPs, hospitals and OHA
- Aim is to improve communication and align system perspectives to better address needs, supporting the refinement of current processes and the successful implementation of new ones introduced in HB 2005
- Returning to the legislature in 2027 to revisit and discuss what we have learned
