









- *Rewards are limited to 1 per youth rider







Where does our funding come from?



50% of CAT Funding Comes from STIF



With the additional STIF funds CAT will maintain services, slightly increase demand response services, and focus on moving forward Capital projects.





For the next 2 years current services will be maintained. However, once the additional STIF funds sunset CAT will likely need to:

- Reduce Mobility Management services provided to seniors, individuals with disabilities and youth who need additional assistance using bus services.
- Service cuts may occur resulting in less early or weekend service.
 Overall, these changes are projected to result in the reduction of 15% of our staff.
